

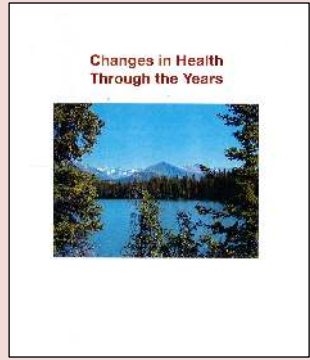


Tsilhqot'in Health Hub

2013-2014

Traditional Wellness and Alternative Medicines Symposium held for Elders – March 24th and 25th

Physical Therapy Services available at Redstone, Nemiah, Anaham, Stone and Toosey.

Mental Health Clinician Hired to work in Toosey, Stone and Nemiah.

FNHA Funding Advisors to each community to discuss the new five year funding agreements and encourage communities to do new Health Plans.

Project Board and Health Actions \$ announced. Meetings with Health Directors to determine how to use the funding. Strategic Planning in Dec to develop a plan

2nd UBC Dental Clinic Held in Tl'etinqox-t'in.
Three day Clinic with 25 Students and Supervisors. Treated 75 community members

Cultural Competency Training for staff members of the hospital was suggested. Three Tsilhqot'in ladies agreed to develop curriculum to teach.

LOU Committee Identified complaints as a priority to work on with Interior Health. Peace Making Training was done with workers from Patient Quality Office

Funding Received from FNHA to do Nation Planning.

Doctor Recruited for Nemiah after not having one for two years.

Funding Approved by Ministry of Health for another Nurse Practitioner Position. Position posted with Interior Health

2014-2015

Contracted Psychiatrist to do Assessment for Mental Health will be available to our Nation.

Trauma Training will be offered and a crisis response Team will hopefully be established to respond to Crisis

Gardening Specialist will be working with communities to develop or enhance current community gardens

Feasibility Study for an Elders home with be completed this year.

Traditional Wellness Coordinator Develop a plan on how to incorporate Traditional Wellness Into existing health services

Mental Health Clinician to work in communities to compliment the work of the contracted services already there
